

Title of BIP: « Multidisciplinary approaches to Antiquity and its heritage » Regards croisés sur les femmes et la condition féminine dans l'Antiquité

General information

Objectives and Description:

For more than three decades, the history of women in Antiquity has been enjoying a real revival. The intensive programme will address the study of women and the women's condition in Antiquity through different types of sources (literature, laws, coins), different disciplines (history, classics, numismatics, epigraphy), different cultural areas (Greek and Roman worlds) and periods, with the emphasis on the Roman Empire (Early Roman Empire and Later Roman Empire). This subject, at the crossroads of social history, cultural and literary history and gender studies, will offer Masters students and doctoral candidates in the field of Antiquity a multidisciplinary approach based on the most recent research, within an international framework.

Methods and outcomes:

Conferences and seminars from a multidisciplinary perspective. Group work on case studies. Acquire skills and knowledge in the field of ancient science (history, literature, epigraphic and numismatic documentation, etc.) on the question of the status and condition of women.
