- Discuss issues related to labour rights, exploitation, and job opportunities.

- Encourage collaborative research projects that combine insights from sociology, economics, urban planning, and environmental studies.
- Develop interdisciplinary approaches to studying immigration and its impacts.

### 6. Enhancing Pedagogical Practices:

- Implement active learning methodologies, such as project-based learning and critical pedagogy, to engage students in practical problem-solving.
- Facilitate workshops and seminars that promote critical thinking and interactive discussions on immigration-related issues.

# 7. Showcasing Student Research:

- Provide platforms for students to present their research findings, such as powerpoint sessions and panel discussions.
- Encourage students to develop and present innovative solutions to challenges related to immigration and territorial reconfiguration.

### 8. Fostering Global Citizenship:

- Promote an understanding of global interdependencies and the importance of inclusive societies.
- Encourage students to engage in advocacy and policy-making processes related to immigration and sustainable development.

By achieving these objectives, this BIP will provide a comprehensive understanding of the complex role of immigration in the reconfiguration of territories, equipping students with the knowledge and skills to address contemporary challenges in this field.
