- Grant #1: Migration Specialist for the Maghreb Region.
- Grant #2: Specialization in mobility in the Maghreb region, focusing on Maghreb–Europe relations within the broader border regime, including EU border externalization policies.
- Grant #3: Migration specialist for Southeast Asia.
- Grant #4: Specialization in mobility and social change in the Middle East.
- Grant #5: Specialization in mobility patterns in Asia, with a focus on irregular migration and transnational networks.
- Grant #6: Specialization in comparative perspectives on mobility and migration governance across Europe.

General Eligibility Criteria:

Grant #1: A PhD and expertise in mobility patterns in the Maghreb region.

Grant #2: PhD and competences on Sub-Saharan migrants in the Maghreb; demographic aging and the role of migration; and youth and mobility in the region.

Grant #3: PhD and expertise in mobility patterns in the Southeast Asia region.

Grant #4: PhD and specialization with a particular focus on Turkey's role as a transit country, inclusion policies, the role of both state and non-state actors, and the negotiation of belonging in contexts of mobility.

Grant #5: PhD and experience in China.

Grant #6: PhD and competences on diversity, religion, and intergenerational differences.

Grant #7: PhD in Social Work and a record of research and published work in cross-country social policy comparison between Romania and another country.
